The number of people living or staying in your home on **4.1.2020**



Whether your home is **owned with or without mortgage or loan, rented or occupied without rent**



A **phone number** for a person in your home

"If disability data is not collected in the 2020 Census it must not matter to people with disabilities, right?"—WRONG
