Dear Secretary Perdue, Administrator Miller, and Deputy Under Secretary Lipps:

The Consortium for Citizens with Disabilities (CCD) Financial Security and Poverty Taskforce writes to thank you for the continued extension of nationwide flexibilities<sup>1</sup> that allow free school meals for all children throughout the entire 2020-2021 school year under the authority of the recently passed Continuing Appropriations Act of 2021 (H.R. 8337). CCD is the largest coalition of national organizations working together to advocate for federal public policy that ensures the self-determination, independence, empowerment, integration and inclusion of children and adults with disabilities in all aspects of society.

The extension of these flexibilities come at an important time as studies suggest that higher rates of households are saying they cannot provide enough food for everyone under their roofs since the pandemic began<sup>2</sup>. Additionally, food insecurity rates are estimated to have tripled among households with children<sup>2</sup>. This extension will ensure children, including those with disabilities, who rely on free and reduced-price school meals remain fed throughout the rest of the school year. We believe that one of the last things children and their families should need to worry about during a global pandemic is access to meals and nutrition assistance.
