

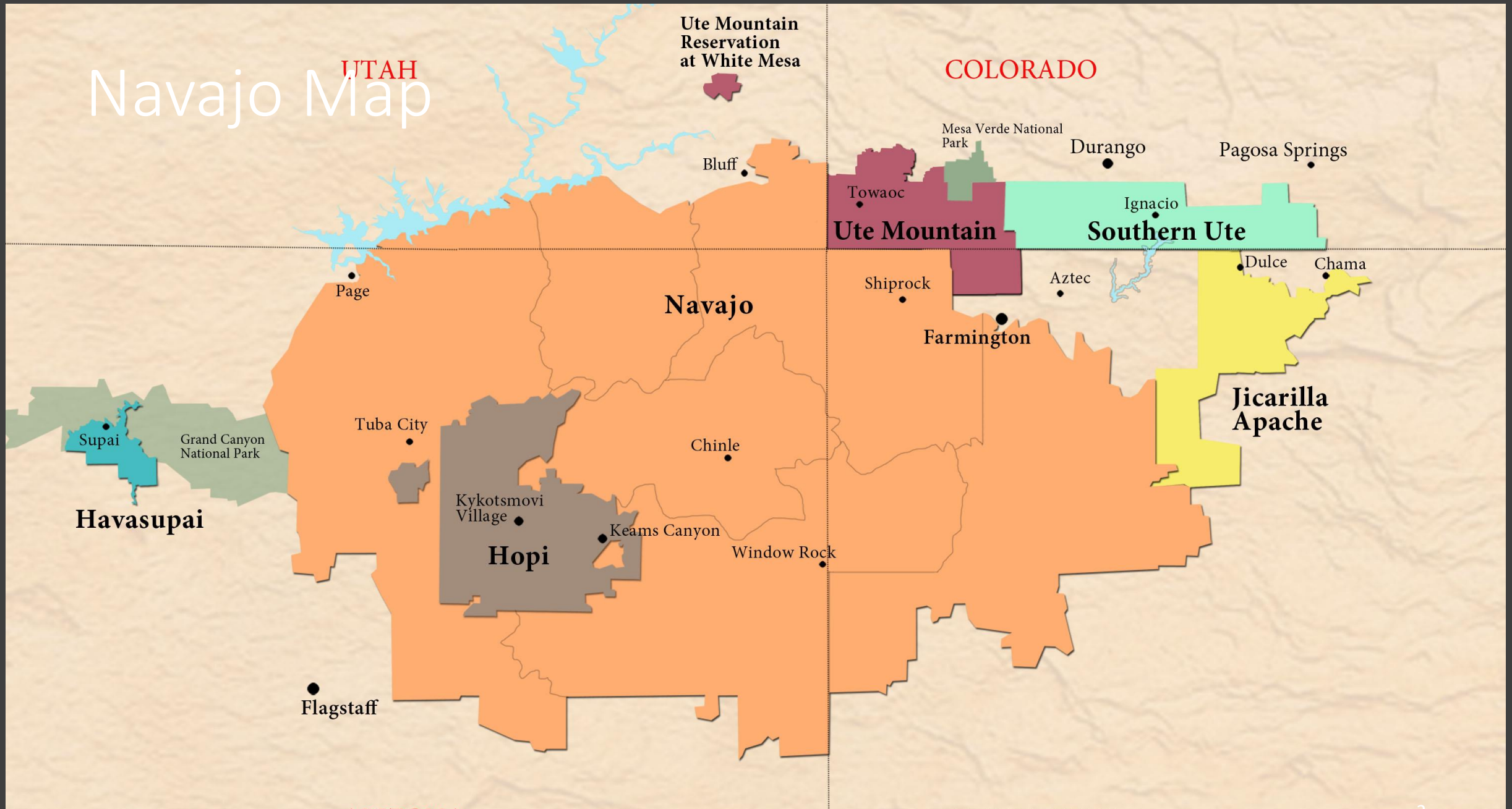

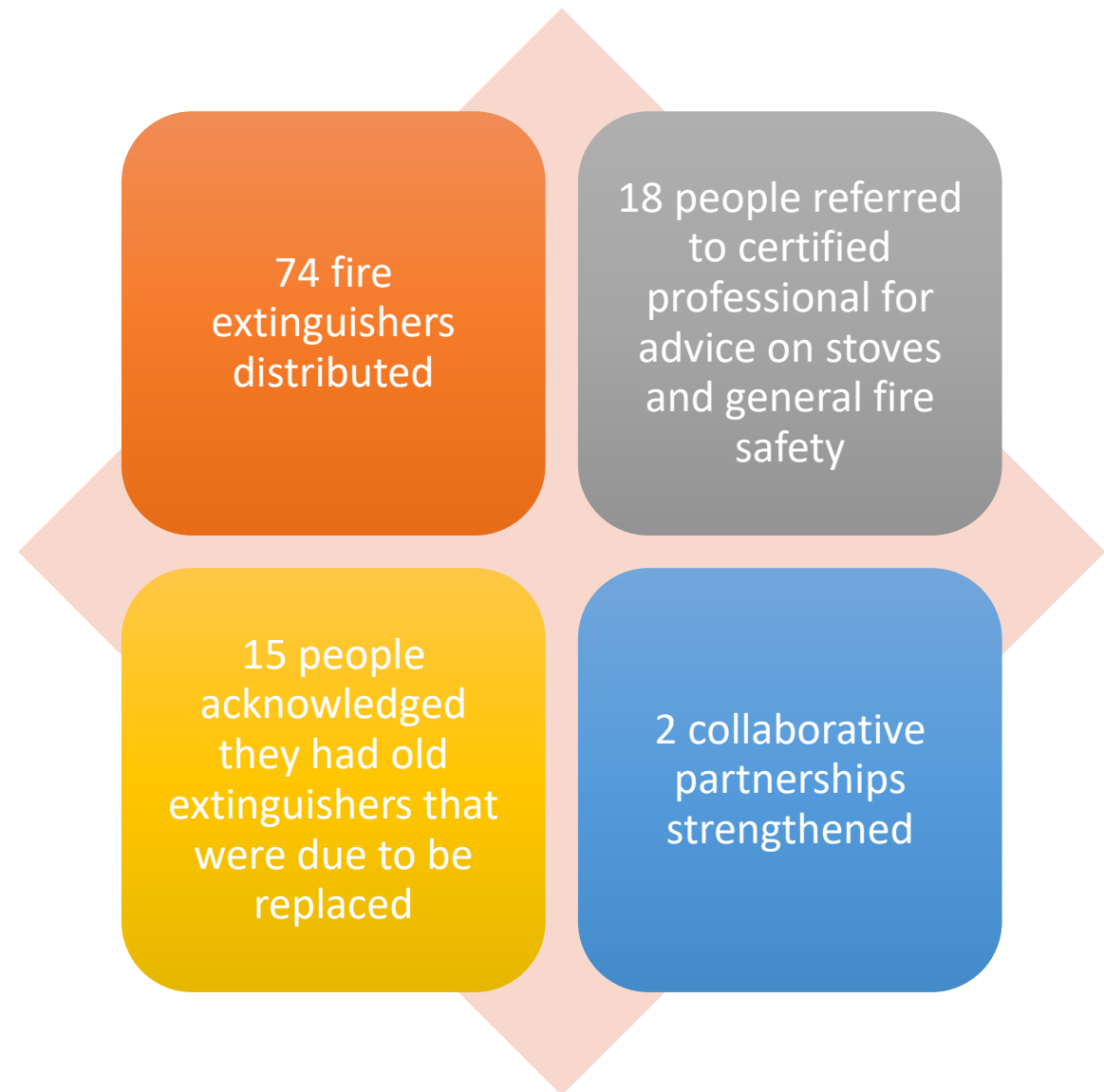

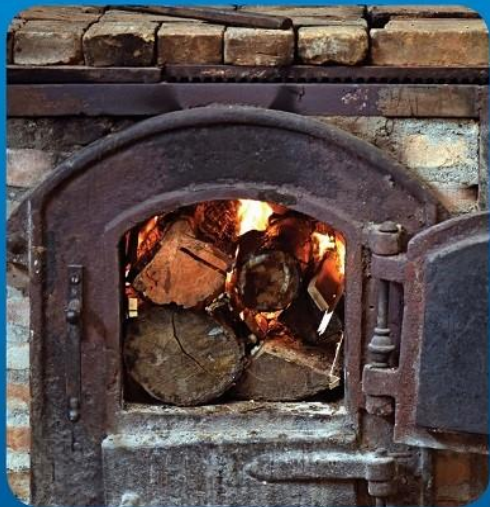

# Outcomes







Do you have an old stove that needs to be replaced?

Does your stove not keep your house warm throughout the night?

Do you have extra smoke in your home coming from your stove?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may be eligible to participate in the **Four Corners Wood and Coal Burning Appliance Replacement and Home Weatherization Project**. This Project will replace inefficient, higher-polluting wood-burning or coal-burning

### What are the eligibility requirements?

- Household is located in one of the following Navajo Nation Chapters:
 

- Shiprock	- Upper Fruitland
- Nenahnezad	- Tse Daa K'aan (Hogback)
- Tse anaozt'ii (Sanostee)	- Tiis Tsoh Sikaad (Burnham)
- San Juan	
- Household income is no more than 150% of the United States Health and Human Services Poverty Level.<sup>1</sup> See Application Guidelines Item 3.
- Household uses an **older, inefficient wood- or coal-burning stove** as the main source of heat in their home. Eligible stoves are wood or coal stoves that are not EPA-certified and EPA-certified stoves that are more than 20 years old or determined by our representative to need repair.

First priority will be given to households with one or more of the following in the household:

- Elder(s)
- Child(ren)
- Veteran(s), and/or
- Someone with a cardiovascular or respiratory health condition (this includes heart or breathing health conditions such as asthma, COPD and heart failure)
