Dear Representative Dingell:

The National Disability Rights Network (NDRN)* writes to thank you for sponsoring the Real Emergency Access for Aging and Disability Inclusion for Disasters (READI) Act, H.R. 2371. This piece of legislation will work to provide long-needed services for people with disabilities before, during, and after disasters.

Starting with Hurricane Katrina, NDRN and the P&A Network began to focus more on the issues surrounding emergency preparedness, emergency management, and recovery. This included formulating Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) with the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) and the Red Cross. These MOUs have ensured the P&As access to emergency shelters, greater involvement in preparedness tasks being performed at the state and local levels, and involvement in more planning and training activities.

People with disabilities are disproportionately impacted by disasters. Emergency Management Systems often do not have policies put into place to accommodate residents with disabilities, and many of the P&As routinely work on emergency management services for their residents. The training and technical assistance provided under the READI Act will better equip state and local services to accommodate disaster victims during major disasters.
